Proposals for posters are invited from **postgraduate and postdoctoral researchers of any relevant discipline** whose work contemplates **petitioning, political participation and/or public engagement in early modern Europe**. Suggested areas for contribution include;

- Methods and uses of petitioning
- Evolving forms and conventions of petitions, protestations or supplications
- Presentation of petitions – including ritual and the use of space
- Petitionary sources as evidence for the growth or increased visibility of public participation
- Varying institutional contexts and conditions for petitioning
